Sometimes it SHOULD NOT BE discussed! Everyone knows about it, it is what it is, let it go!

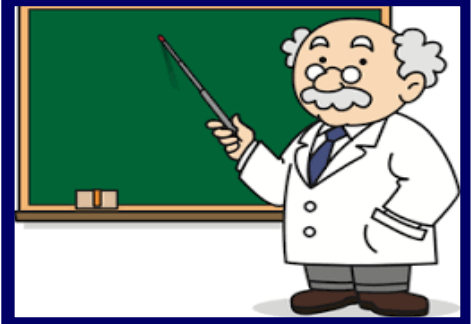

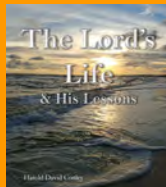
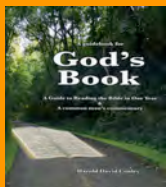
Homecoming!

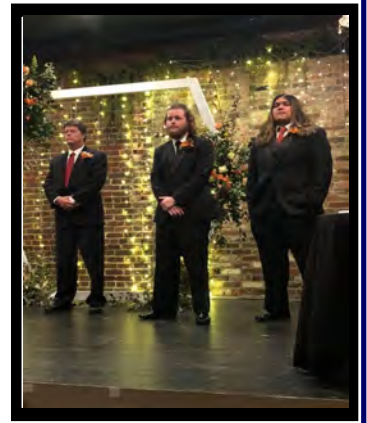
