THREE of my favorite girls had Birthdays in February!


Madison - 18th - Granddaughter

God said in **Proverbs 16:18** "Pride goeth before destruction, and an haughty spirit before a fall."


If we refuse to humble ourselves, we will soon have ourselves humbled!
