David's Devotional Is It Just A Show?

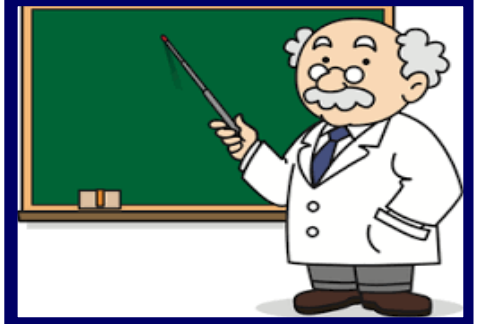
"And they come unto thee as the people cometh, and they sit before thee as my people, and they hear thy words, but they will not do them: for with their mouth they show much love, but their heart goeth after their covetousness. And, lo, thou art unto them as a very lovely song of one that hath a pleasant voice, and can play well on an instrument: for they hear thy words, but they do them not. And when this cometh to pass, (lo it will come,) then shall they know that a prophet hath been among them." Ezekiel 33:31-33

God told Ezekiel that, although he was preaching very powerful words from God and attracting a large crowd, he would not be very effective because the people would obey the words!

I remember, when I was in my late teens, hearing one of the best preachers I had ever heard. Everybody talked about him. People came from everywhere to hear him! These people heard serious messages, yet were not moved at all! They were warned to change their lives before Jesus returns, but they did not. When it comes to pass, (and it will come) then they will know that the truth was preached! They told everyone what a great job he did, but they did not obey the Gospel! They all went to hear his words, but they simply did not intend to obey them and change their lives! Is it just a show, or do we listen to learn and grow?

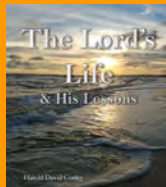
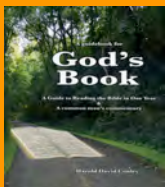

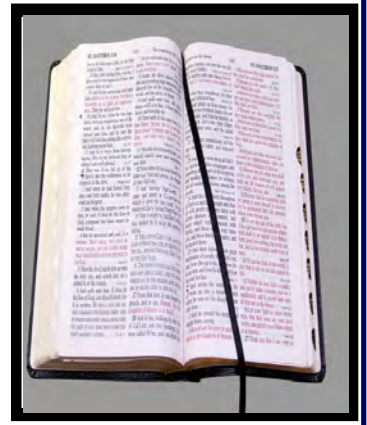

Study the Bible by Asking the Right Questions!

When we study any writing, there are important questions to ask concerning the text.



When studying the Bible we can ask these same questions. The answers to these questions can illuminate the text for better understanding.

These important questions are:

WHO; WHAT; WHEN; WHERE; WHY; & HOW

WHEN? When was the text written? This could shed light on very important issues that will help us understand the author's purpose for writing.

WHO? Who wrote the text? Who was the intended audience? The answers to these questions could give us an insight on preconceived values and beliefs of the readers and even the writer.

WHERE? Where in the world was the author writing from? Where in the world was his intended audience? These questions allow us to focus on distance and circumstances.

WHY? Why did the writer write the letter in the first place? This is VERY IMPORTANT to understanding the text! Without the WHY we could justify almost any interpretation of the writing. With the WHY we can interpret the writing in light of the reason the text was written.

WHAT? What did the writer say? What did the writer MEAN? There is a very distinct difference sometimes from what the words are and the INTENT of the words. Jesus' parables are prime examples where he SAID one thing, but he MEANT for a deeper and more profound interpretation to be learned!

HOW? How does this writing FIT in with the writings of other authors and the universal message from God?
