Philippians 4:8

“Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, **think on these things.**” (KJV)

INTRODUCTION

The mind is the starting point for behavior. When Satan wants to entice a person to sin, he starts in the mind. (*Lust of Flesh, Lust of Eyes, Pride of Life*) **I John 2:16.**

If our minds are convinced, our behavior will follow. We can control our behavior (and even the behavior of others to a great extent) by affecting the thoughts of the mind. **Romans 12:2** “*And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.*”

Satan obviously wanted Adam and Eve to “*sin*”. Sin is the transgression of God’s law (I John 3:4). Sin is when we behave in a way that breaks or transgresses God’s commandment. Adam and Eve were told not to eat the fruit of the tree of knowledge of good and evil. If they did, they would be punished with death. To influence their behavior (eat the fruit), Satan began his attacks in their minds!

In **Philippians 4:7** (*the verse prior to our text*) Paul said, “*And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.*”

Paul said the “*peace of God*” will “*guard our hearts and minds*”. How? “*Through Christ Jesus*”.

How is our mind guarded by God’s peace through Jesus Christ? How does our minds find peace, tranquility, calmness, etc. which will secure us as we live for Christ?

Paul understood there were some things to DO. There is a certain set of behaviors that we must have before we can have peace from God. **Philippians 4:9** “*Those things, which ye have both learned, and received, and heard, and seen in me do; and the God of peace shall be with you.*” To encourage this behavior, Paul started with their minds, “*learned, and received, and heard, and seen in me*”. He knew that behaviors that lead to peace must begin in the mind!

Sandwiched between verses **7 & 9** is verse **8** (*our study text*). Paul gives us a list of qualities to “*think on*” which will affect our behavior in a positive way. This will ensure the peace of God in our lives that we yearn for.

“Finally, brethren, ...”

Jesus is addressing Christians.

We Christians struggle with the battle for our mind. We have decided to follow Jesus. We have made up our mind to serve Him. Satan now has even more incentive to conquer us. He is not as concerned about those who have already decided to reject Christ. The battle for their minds may be to affect their behavior in ways that will cause Christians to stumble.

Atheists have decided there is no God. This is foolish (Psalm 14:1 & Psalm 53:1). However, Satan can use these atheists to shake the faith of Christians. They may challenge their faith with “foolish questions”. This attacks their minds. Paul told his students, Timothy and Titus, to avoid such questions (II Timothy 2:23 & Titus 3:9).

Paul told Timothy not to listen to things that confuse and contribute to speculation. Instead, he should concentrate on things that encourage and build faith (I Timothy 1:4).
