David's Devotional PREACH

Paul was zealous for the Gospel of Jesus Christ! It didn't matter if he was rich or poor, free or bound, healthy or wounded, he had one thought in mind ... PREACH! Paul was so passionate about the Gospel being preached he actually said, "*Some indeed preach Christ even of envy and strife; and some also of good will: The one preach Christ of contention, not sincerely, supposing to add affliction to my bonds: But the other of love, knowing that I am set for the defense of the gospel. What then? Notwithstanding, every way, whether in pretense, or in truth, Christ is preached; and I therein do rejoice, yea, and will rejoice.*" (Philippians 1:15-18)

Paul was happy Christ was preached even if the preacher was doing it for the wrong reasons! Wow! Paul did not care if some were preaching to hurt him or preaching in pretense! He was just glad that Christ was preached!

Paul did not care about his heritage, his education, his past religion, or his past religious status! In fact, he said he considered all those things to be manure in order to "win Christ"! (Philippians 3:4-8) Paul told the Corinthians, "For though I preach the gospel, I have nothing to glory of: for necessity is laid upon me; yea, woe is unto me, if I preach not the gospel!" (I Corinthians 9:16)


In his "final words" Paul told Timothy to "Preach the word". (II Timothy 4:2)


Mississippi State Senate
