

Labor Day

There was a time when it was common for laborers to work 18 and even 20 hours a day. Even Jesus told the story of a man that hired workers to work in his field for 12 hours (6:00 am to 6:00 pm) **Matthew 20:1-16**.

Are those hours too many? Is the 8-hour workday better? Why not 6 hours? Why not 4 hours? Remember, some only worked 1 hour in the story Jesus told!

Someone suggested that if you love what you do, it is not really “*work*”! Should these people work 24 hours a day? Don’t they have a family? Don’t they need to eat or sleep?

Here are some things God says about labor:

I Timothy 5:18 The laborer is worthy of his reward

Ephesians 4:28 Labor so we can give to others

Hebrews 4:11 If we want true rest, we must labor

Just remember what **I Corinthians 3:9** says, “*For we are laborers together with God: ye are God’s husbandry, ye are God’s building.*”

We work for God! Working for God is a 24/7 proposition. His labor can be challenging (**Luke 9:23**), but He promises to share the load (**Matthew 11:29**) and His commandments are not grievous (**I John 5:3**)!
