David's Devotional Try Him!

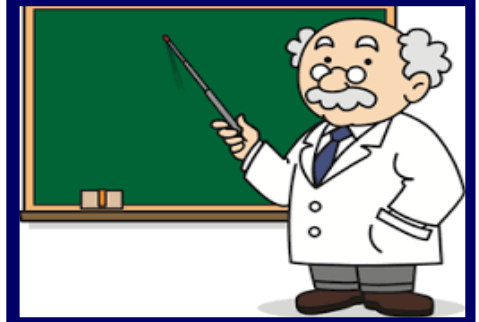
The scripture forbids "tempting" the Lord. Jesus himself quoted **Deuteronomy 6:16** when he said, "Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God." **Matthew 4:7**

Panda Bears get about two or three feet tall and are about four to six feet long. They can weigh up to 300 lbs.!

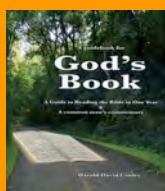
